## Golden Rock League of Merit introduced on Kingdom Day

ST. EUSTATIUS--Kingdom Day 2015 marked the inauguration Tuesday of St. Eustatius' own order of decorations to honouring its worthy citizens: The Golden Rock League of Merit. In a fully packed Vincent Astor Lopes Legislative Hall, ten Statians were decorated with the medal symbolising them being part of a special group of outstanding members of the community.

The local decorations programme is a 2011 initiative of then Commissioner Clyde van Putten, who requested that Sharon Blair and Walter Hellebrand put together a system of decorations. Their proposal and the medals, which were designed by Hellebrand, were unanimously adopted by the Island Council in October 2011.

The system works along the same lines as the Dutch national royal decorations but without ranks. Instead, there are various categories to recognise specific individual talents and contributions: being an Exceptional Inspiration; Outstanding Contribution to Society: Excellence in Dedication: Extraordinary Achievement; Valour; and High Esteem

The first honourees of the Medal of Extraordinary Achievement to acknowledge outstanding achievement in a particular field were Elva Arnaud for her exceptional efforts in the area of sports in creating opportunities for the young and adult alike

Eric Demming was awarded father than any medal before for his continuous energy to keep Statia's string band music alive and Marcella Gibbs-Marsdin for her devotion to continuing Statia traditions, such as the July 1 Flamboyant decorations and July Day singing. The youngest recipient Asha Robins was awarded as a role model for the youth for her commitment to excelling

The first recipients of the Medal of Outstanding Contribution to Society for helping the further development of Statia were Alvin Courtar for advancing the growth of business on the island; Cyrill Tearr for being an inspirational example of a successful selfmade business man; and Louise van Putten for serving her island in various civil servant's roles in a dignified manner over 40 years.

The first Medals of Excellence in Dedication, for putting years of one's life at the service of Statia's people, went to Henry Hassell for his extensive career at Public Works and to Mevrille Hazel for demonstrating the potential of agriculture on the island in an encouraging way

Receiving the Medal of High Esteem was Eric Henriquez, "who was a Commissioner for over 11 years, as well as an Island Council member for many years.

Henriquez' son explained this medal meant more to his

since it recognised his dedication to the wellbeing and welfare of Statia's people

Because the medals did not reach the island in time provisions had been made by the Decorations Committee to arrange for token replacements, with the real medals being presented when they arrive.
