GVP School announces best passing rates in recent years

ST. EUSTATIUS--Gwendoline van Putten (GVP) School has scored the best passing rates in recent years, Principal André Peter IJzerman stated in announcing the passing rates for the exam year 2014-2015.

The school for secondary education in St. Eustatius announced that at VSBO level 68 per cent of candidates passed their exams, compared with 43 per cent last year. At HAVO level 80 per cent of candidates passed; in 2014, the rate was 67 per cent. At MBO level 95 per cent of candidates passed, against 77 per cent last year.

"The school board, management and staff are very proud of all our graduates. We congratulate those that have successfully completed their studies. The board and management sincerely thank the students and the teachers for their perseverance, dedication and hard work," IJzerman said in a statement.

"Compared to former years, our exam results have improved considerably and we are happy for this. This is the best passing rate in recent years for the school. Although this will not be an easy task, we will continue working on further improvement on these results in the upcoming years," the GVP principal said.

"We thank all the stakeholders who were somehow involved in the development of all our students. Together, we are able to give the students the education they deserve which helps them to a

further study and successful career," IJzerman said.

The school held its graduation ceremony of Class 2015 on Tuesday, under the theme: "Building our Empire. I'd rather stand tall, than live on my knees."

The programme consisted of speeches by Commissioner of Education Reginald Zaandam, School Board representative C. Rivers-Berkel and Principal IJzerman. Ariel Herrera was the keynote speaker for the event.

Several valedictorians also gave speeches. Valedictorians of the class of 2015 were Lysette Woodley (HAVO), Khalishandra Wilmans (VMBO-B), Shevonte Tokaai (VMBO-T), Akimo Warner (PRO), Jaleesa Henriquez (VMBO-K) and Algerene Carti (MBO).

The 60 graduates in total, divided over HAVO (8), VMBO-B (9), VMBO-T (7), PRO (5), VMBO-K (12) and MBO (19), were presented with a programme, which included presentations by Mega D. Youth Foundation, Aloë Sofisticated Dancers and an act by the teachers.

Man arrested on burglary charge

ANGUILLA--A report Wednesday, July 1, where from the Royal Anguilla Police Force states that on Tuesday, June 30, a 24-year-old man from St. John's Valley was arrested and charged with burglary. The arrest was the result of a police investigation into a report of a burglary at the DR Enterprise Offices in the Caribbean Commercial Centre on June 25, at 1:20am.
